## **RECOMMENDATIONS:**

- We summerized recommendations for biodiversity conservation: regional planning; site-scale management; and modification of existing conservation species. We identify major gaps, including the need for more specific, operational examples of adaptation principles that are consistent with unavoidable uncertainty about the future; a practical adaptation planning process to guide selection and integration of recommendations into existing policies; and greater integration of social science into an endeavor that, although dominated by ecology, increasingly recommends extension beyond reserves and into human-occupied landscapes.
- Acousto-informatics: generation, management and application of acoustic database using advanced computing techniques. It may be used for identification, monitoring and management of animal biodiversity.
- Some planning is required in order to understand and develop the ecotourism Evaluation of existing infrastructure and gap analysis, including existing access opportunities. Assess level of community interest in ecotourism enterprise development;
- Develop checklist of requirements for viable ecotourism industry; and
- Agreement on community tourism standards (i.e. environmental, social, and cultural considerations or concerns)
- Nature based Ecotourism Scenario and Sustainable development of Forest management.
- Further research is needed on Impact of pollution on National and World Heritage.
