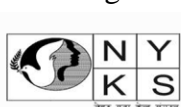

- "Boosting Immunity is Need of the Hour"

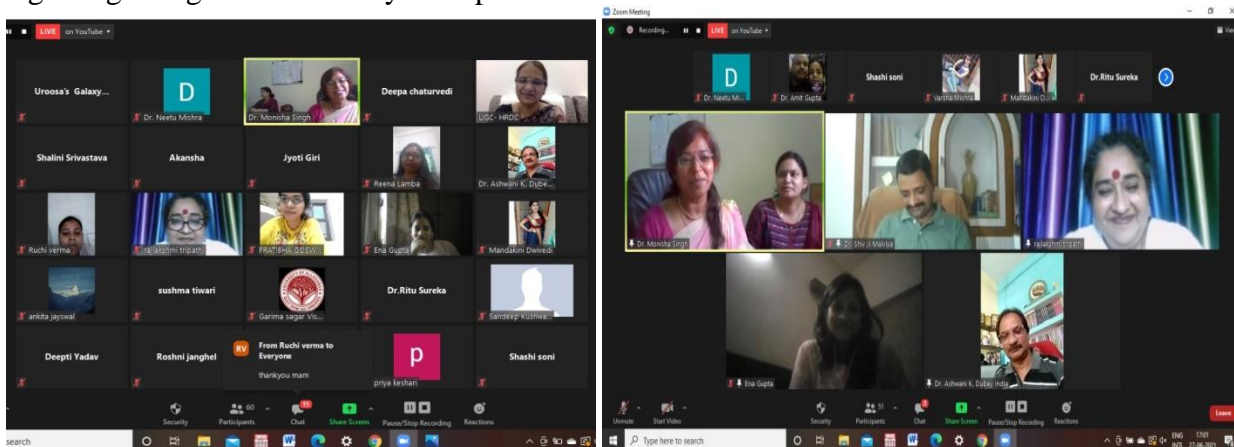

students. She also expressed her sincere thanks to other seniors and colleagues of the institution for joining and gracing the webinar by their presence.



The Chief Guest for the Webinar Dr. Kiran Katoch, Ex. Director National Jalma Institute of Leprosy and other Mycobacterial Diseases (Indian Council of Medical Research), Agra Uttar Pradesh said that physical and mental health are interlinked and influence each other. If the health is not proper it leads to stress which results in various life style diseases. To preserve health it is mandatory to follow good hygienic practices. Environmental cleanliness and sanitation needs to be focused on. She also talked about the evolution of Sanitation programmes of the Government of India with a special emphasis on the Swaccha Bharat Abhiyan. The Aarogya Foundation Project in two blocks of Jharkhand helped in improving social harmony-clashes on garbage dumping and the water accumulation supply sharply decreased. According to her though vaccines and other interventions improve disease control and we have a feeling of well-being but Sanitation in itself is the best vaccine. Gandhiji also saw cleanliness and sanitation as vehicles of change and encouraged use of evidence based practices. She concluded by saying that with the participation of society at large much more can be achieved and we can contribute to the health and well-being of the society.

Guest of Honor, Dr. Shiv Ji Malviya, Deputy Secretary, Uttar Pradesh Higher Education Commission, Prayagraj said that in order to lead an active and stress free life we have to keep our body healthy. Within the last two years the importance of immunity and cleanliness has increased manifold. He said that education is the foundation of hygiene and cleanliness. He concluded with the slogan “*Ab na hoga Beemariyon ka Karobaar, Uthao Swacchta Ka Hatiyaar*”

Dr. Ashwani Kumar Dubey, Executive Director Environment and Social Welfare (EWS) Society, Khajuraho highlighted the need of balanced diet, immunity boosting foods and following a traditional lifestyle for a healthy living. He also stressed on the importance of Home Science subject which should be included in the curriculum of Universities everywhere.

She shared various instances of women like Kamaljeet Kaur, Sakshi Bakshi, The ‘Mushroom Lady of Bihar’, Anita Devi who have begun their startups during the Covid-19 pandemic and are serving

the society in the field of health and nutrition. The startups for future should be based on your passion, knowledge and skill enhancement. There should be ample research in the area in which one wants to do a startup.

The second speaker for the session Dr. Shalini Srivastava, Senior Dietician, King George Medical College, Lucknow, Uttar Pradesh gave us insights into “Malnutrition in Tribal Women”. She discussed the causes of malnutrition in Tribal women like lack of education, inadequate diet, cultural differences, poverty, geographical discrimination etc. We have to work on holistic development to tackle malnutrition such as educational empowerment of women, use of Information, education and communication in a realistic manner. She also pointed out the various government initiatives like Ayushman Bharat Yojna (2019), Pradhanmantri Surakshit Matratva Abhiyan (2016) and the National Health Mission. She also talked about the signs and symptoms of nutritional anaemia commonly diagnosed in every one or the other woman. She focused that good health/wellness can be maintained in traditional ways like a healthy food plate which promotes health, prevents hidden hunger and protects from diseases. Eat Right India is a government initiative which encompasses 14 programmes for combating nutritional anaemia. Food fortification, Super foods, high calorie, highprotein, HBU blends, Tulsi are some of the common measures which may be undertaken for preventing malnutrition. She stressed that a healthy woman is the basis for a healthy family.

The next speaker for the session was Dt. Preeti Pandey, Chief Dietician, Apollo Hospital Lucknow. She discussed “Nutritional Strategies for Stress Management”. She said that stress occurs when pressure is greater than resource. Stress is body’s response to physical, mental or emotional pressure. Stress can have a lot of bad effects but it can be managed well by following a healthy routine and adopting proper eating and sleeping pattern. She said that when our body is stressed there is a depletion of major nutrients from our body like Calcium, magnesium, Potassium, Proteins and Vitamins A, B, C. She expressed that balanced nutrition enhances our capacity to cope with stress. There has to be a proper combination of diet and exercise for stress reduction.

The next speaker for the session, Dr. Anjula Sahai, an Obstetrician and Gynecologist & Infertility IVF, IUI expert at Jeevan Jyoti Hospital, Prayagraj spoke on “Health, Hygiene and Sanitation”. She basically laid stress on three things i.e. Staying healthy, maintaining proper hygiene and self-care and acceptance. She said that failure to maintain hygiene can have many negative implications and can lead to social and psychological problems. Personal hygiene is very crucial for maintaining proper health apart from environmental hygiene, public hygiene and immunization. The Covid era has taught people how to live a healthy life style but we need to maintain it in the future also.

Dr. Rekha Sharma, Professor (Food and Nutrition), Deputy Director, HRDC RTM University, Nagpur, focused on the “Role of Balanced Diet on Women’s Health”. She discussed the concept of balanced diet, macro and micro nutrients for good health of sedentary, moderate and pregnant women. She provided in-depth information on the concept of Estimated Average requirement (EAR), Average Nutrient Requirement (ANR) and Tolerable Upper Limit (TVL, RDA and its importance in nutrient calculation. She also presented a summary of RDA, ICMR and NIN 2020. She focused on the role of iron folate and vitamin A in the maintenance of health. She said that we have to keep in mind that the average protein, iron, folic acid and vitamin A requirement is higher in girls as compared to boys at the age of 10-12 years. The requirement of Ca, Mg, Fe, Iodine, Folic acid and Vitamin A requirement also increases at the time of pregnancy and lactation. Intake of calcium rich foods may prevent osteoporosis, neural tube defects and other morbidities.

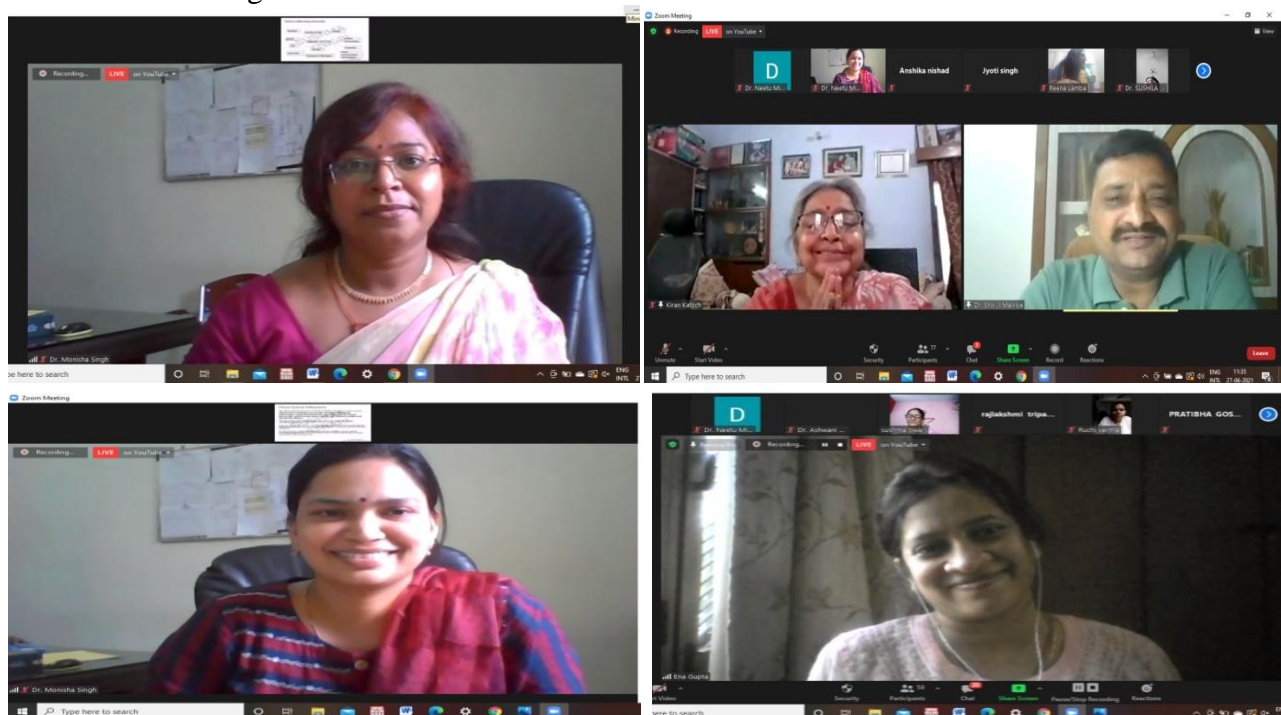

The next speaker for the Webinar Mrs. Sushma Tiwari, CDE, RD, DHA, Consultant MNT, Regional office, IAPEN, Prayagraj, Nutritional Consultant Safe Society NGO, Lucknow talked on the theme “Boosting Immunity is Need of the Hour”. She described in a very simple yet effective manner the role of immune system in maintaining a positive health and the factors which affect our immunity. Nutrition has a vital role to play in immune function which protects our body from diseases and infections. Optimal nutrition supports the function of the immune cells. Our immune system demands adequate nutrients both from exogenous and endogenous sources. The micronutrients and dietary components have specific role in immunity development. She laid stress on the role of spices, herbs, milk, milk products, fruits and vegetables for building up our immunity. The basic motto of her lecture was that our health is in our HANDS. H is for healthy diet, A is for adequate rest, N is for no to high fat, salt and sugar foods, no to addiction, D for daily exercise and S for stress which has to be handled with positivity. The food for thought was that it’s imperative to build up our immune system if it is unhealthy or to maintain it if it is healthy but we do not have to boost our immune system as it may prove counterproductive sometimes.
